million U.S. adults have taken an educational trip to learn or improve a skill, sport or hobby in the past three years. And just about every past-time has a camp. A search of GrownUpCamps.com turns up summer programs for photography, sewing, whale-watching, dance, vegetarian cooking, weight-loss and more.

For example, Paradise Golf Academy, with locations in Ft. Myers and Orlando, offers weekend, three- and five-day getaways that provide campers with access Pricing for the golf getaways, which includes free time to hit the links, ranges from \$700 per person for a two-day weekend camp, to \$1,700 for the premier five-day school, not including lodging.

While rejuvenation and recreation are popular adult-camp destinations, adventure camps offer the most unique experiences. According to Adventure Travel Report, 98 million U.S. adults have taken an adventure trip in the past five years.


Some of those campers went

to Space Camp, at the U.S. Space and Rocket Center in Huntsville, Ala., which is celebrating its 25th anniversary this year. The Space Academy® for Adults puts people ages 19-99 to the test in out-of-thisworld astronaut-training activities and simulated space-shuttle missions. A ride in the SpaceShot™ gives campers the experience of four Gs of force, the 1/6th Gravity Trainer simulates walking on the moon, and the Multi-Axis Trainer simulates



a tumble through space. The Space Academy is available in three-, six- and eight-day packages, with prices starting at \$399. And for parents that would feel guilty about experiencing Space Camp without the kids, there are parent-child camps, too.

For those with a tad more money to spend, there are the extreme camp experiences offered through Incredible-Adventures.com, such as the Key West Shark Weekend. It's three days spent aboard the Research Vessel Tiburon, within the Tortugas Ecological Reserve and Marine Sanctuary, in different diving encounters with a variety of sharks and loggerhead turtles. The fee for the undersea adventure camp starts at \$2,600 per person. (Private charters start at \$25,000.)

Florida - and the country for that matter - Incredible Adventures.com offers "MiGs Over Moscow." Campers spend five days in Moscow, and have the opportunity to pilot - with the help of a professional – a jet fighter, including the MiG-29 or MiG-31 Foxhound. Security clearance and a pre-flight medical are required. Prices range from \$15,000 for a single flight to \$87,000 for the "Top Secret Double Agent Flight program." And while the flight on a MiG is covered in the camp's fee, the flights to and from Russia aren't.

Summer camps for big kids exist in every possible niche. So, if you're getting a little jealous planning your kids' summer, consider getting away yourself. Chances are, you won't have to worry about getting homesick.
